Abstract

The aim of our study is to dive deep as much as possible into the concept and realities of the Kingdom of God and the perspectives for Humankind. To achieve that goal, the methodology used is based on critical literature review, phenomenology and Biblical methodology which is a method that seeks to shed light upon the historical processes which give rise to the biblical texts. It proceeds from textual criticism to redaction criticism, operating with the help of scientific criteria. The objective of our study is to answer a number of questions useful to shed more light on the importance of the kingdom of God on the physical, psychological and spiritual lives of people and ultimately to spread the gospel of Jesus Christ. The interest of this work is spiritual, philosophical and social. The results of our analysis show that the kingdom of God is the origin and the true home of humankind. 1. Introduction

When we talk of kingdom we usually see dominion, reign, rules and regulations, monarchy. In that line, Kingdom of God, in Christianity refers to the spiritual realm over which God reigns as king, or the fulfillment on Earth of God's will. Therefore if we consider that God is the creator of everything, it implies that this kingdom is reigning over totally everyone and everything.

1. What is The Kingdom of God?

In Matthew 6:9-13, Jesus prayed by saying our « Father in heaven, hallowed be Your name. Your kingdom come. Your will be done On earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread ». Furthermore in the same book of Matthew 3:2, it is written "Repent, change your inner self, your old way of thinking, regrets, past sins; live your life in a way that proves repentance; seek God's purpose for your life, for the kingdom of heaven is at hand."

Therefore the kingdom of heaven or of God is mentionned in the Bible at various instances and we are warn about its coming but what is really the said kingdom? The answer of the Bible to this question is rather clear but unusual as different from human logics and thoughts in the sense that the kingdom of God refers to God's reign on earth and consequent, in our hearts and spirits. It is about His kingship and our obedience to His laws and rules.

In God's kingdom, the greatest is the servant of all, the rich is the one giving without expecting in return, the wise is the one trusting in God without doubting nor suspecting, the first shall be last, the broken are blessed, we look out for our neighbour and we rejoice when the lost are found.

2. What Are The Various Existing Types Of Kingdom?

Spiritual science describes seven kingdoms: three elementary kingdoms and the four kingdoms of nature that we know on Earth. They range from:

- 1. The higher spirit world (the mineral kingdom);
- 2. The lower spirit world (the plant kingdom);
- 3. The astral world (animal kingdom).

Spiritually, 02 kingdoms can be identified which are the kingdom of darkness, ruled by Satan, and the kingdom of light, ruled by Jesus. God wants that our life should be a manifestation of the glory of God bearing fruits of love, peace, joy, patience, mercy, kindness, self control, etc.

Concerning humans kingdoms, it would be difficult to enumerate in details all the kingdoms that have always existed but to sum it up, the Bible give us a detailed appraisal in the book. In Daniel 2: 31-35, « Daniel said the king's dream was about a giant statue that was destroyed by a stone cut out of a mountain. The statue represented the kingdoms of the earth. The stone cut out of the mountain represented the kingdom of God that would fill the earth ».

Furthermore, The statue's gold, silver, bronze, iron, and clay parts represented kingdoms which would come in what was then the future (Daniel 2:36–44). The line of middle east empires such as Babylon, Medo-Persia, Greece, Rome matches that prediction. Most modern scholars agree that the four world empires symbolised by the statue are Babylon (the head), the Medes (arms and shoulders), Persia (thighs and legs) and Seleucid Syria and Ptolemaic Egypt (the feet).¹

3. What Are The Rules In The Kingdom of Yahweh?

The central law that governs God's Kingdom is love, precisely God's love. In 1 Corinthians 13:4–8a, it is stated that:

- Love is patient and kind;
- love does not envy;
- love does not boast;
- love is not arrogant or rude;
- love does not insist on its own way;
- love is not irritable or resentful;
- love does not rejoice at wrongdoing, but rejoices with the

truth.

Hence a citizen of the Kingdom of Yahweh will always put Yahweh first in every action, thoughts or inaction and will behave with Promise, Patience, Praise, Provision, and Power. He will be mournful over sin, submissive to God's will, passionate for righteousness, merciful, compassionate, authentic, ethical, peacemakers, and joyful even when persecuted. God's laws and commands are the rules governing the kingdom of Yahweh.

4. How To Enter The Kingdom of God?

To access the kingdom of God is to ask the key, Jesus Christ is the key. Then it is required to adopt a suitable behaviour which implies living righteously according to God's commands. These are repentance from our evil deeds, reading, meditating the gospel, recognizing Jesus as the Lord and Saviour, receiving the Holy Ghost, endure and overcome trials for the kingdom of God. In a nutshell we need to be active in God's kingdom.

The Holy scriptures tell us in John 3:5. that "... *Unless anyone is born from water and spirit, he cannot enter into the Kingdom of God.*" It is a call to turn away from our former ways and embrace Christ over every thing as Lord and Saviour. A follower of Jesus who is born from water is one who repented of his sins and has been baptized in water.

The Lord says in Matthew 23:13. That "Not everyone who says to Me, 'Lord, Lord,' will enter the kingdom of heaven, but he who does the will of My Father who is in heaven will enter." Christians are told to "seek first the Kingdom of God.

5. Where Is Located The Kingdom of God?

Some bible verses reveal to us where is located the throne of God. In Revelation 4:2-10. It is said that « Immediately I was in the Spirit; and behold, a throne set in heaven, and One sat on the throne ». Psalm 11:4 says : « The Lord is in His holy temple; the Lord's throne is in heaven; His eyes behold, His eyelids test the sons of men. ». This obviously implies that Yahweh's throne is highly lifted up in heavens from where he controls the universe. He has the capacity to be everywhere at the same time and He knows everything and has no beginning and no end.

As demonstrated in Psalm 89:14, the Kingdom of God is founded on righteousness, justice, mercy and truth. Those who serve the Lord, do so in spirit and truth, meaning that spiritual kingdom are immaterial but it is the spirit that controls every flesh.

For our thoughts come purity and impurity determining our life style but not what we eat. Hence the kingdom of God finds location naturally in Yahweh's dwelling place in Holy heavens but also in holy hearts of men. This is in their minds, thoughts, beliefs, choices, actions, desires. All these come from the heart, nurtured before being manifested physically.

6. What Are The Keys of The Kingdom of God?

They key to the kingdom of God is obviously acknowledging Jesus Christ as Lord and Saviour, repenting and abandonning our former sinful nature to embrace the life of Jesus through the fruits of the spitit. The Bible says that the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, longsuffering, gentleness, goodness, faith, meekness, temperance, against such there is no law.

In Matthew 16:19, it is said: "I will give you the keys of the kingdom of heaven, and whatever you bind on earth shall be bound in heaven, and whatever you loose on earth shall be loosed in heaven». Our authority depends on our gathering

and our agreement because when we gather and agree, Jesus is there with us. "For where two or three are gathered in my name, there am I among them" (Matthew 18:20).

7. Can We Materialize The Kingdom of God?

Usually to materialize something is to make it tangible in our world. It means that to materialize the kingdom of God is to be able to touch it, see it, feel it and enjoy it the same way we see countries and continents of this earth.

Eventhough the kingdom of God is not of this world and as such intangible humanly speaking. It is more real as the wind that is blowing or the air we breath. But it is not materialized with corrupt material of our planet. Instead it is spiritual and is experienced in truth and spirits.

Some of the materialization factors of the supreme kingdom of the universe where Yahweh the creator reigns are for instance a happy and positive mind due to the presence of Christ in our heart, self contentment, lack of impudicity, life of prayer, fasting, Bible meditation, repentance. The kingdom ogf God is one based on sharing the word of God which is the ultimate weapon to conquer territories held by our enemy the devil.

God's kingdom represents justice, peace and a fellowship. To seek God's kingdom and His righteousness means to live in that ongoing repentance from sin, and to live in sincere love with Yahweh, from-the-heart, devoted-to-God and our saviour the Lord Jesus Christ.

8. What Are The Mysteries Of The Kingdom Of God?

The concept of Mystery refers to what is yet to be explained or is beyond understanding of the ordinary. The Kingdom of God is a mystery itself. To that can be added a number of other mysteries such as the mystery of the universe, the mystery of man, the mystery of God, the mystery of Christ, and the mystery of the church. Glorious Mysteries of the Holy Rosary including the resurrection, the ascension, the descent of the Holy Spirit on Mary and the apostles, the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary and the Coronation of the Virgin Mary, Queen of Heaven and Earth and Mother of the Church. The whole creation and his creator Yahweh are a mystery that is the reason why Jesus our Saviour spent most of his time revealing us how the kingdom works. In fact, the hidden principles that govern how God's kingdom works and operates have been taught through many different parables. Jesus spent nearly all of His ministry teaching people what God's kingdom is like.

Review of Some Key Passages Concerning The Kingdom of God

- 1. Access to the kingdom of God is selective: "To you it has been given to know the secrets of the kingdom of heaven, but to them it has not been given." Matthew 13:24
- 2. The house of God holds the keys to the kingdom of God: « I will give you the keys of the kingdom of heaven, and whatever you bind on earth shall be bound in heaven, and whatever you loose on earth shall be loosed in heaven » Matthew 16:9
- 3. The kingdom of God is priority and door to other riches: « But seek first his kingdom and his righteousness, and all these things will be given to you as well ». Matthew 6:33
- 4. The kingdom of God is everlasting contrarily to other kingdoms: « Your throne, O God, is forever and ever.

- The scepter of your kingdom is a scepter of uprightness ». Psalm 45:6
- 5. The kingdom of God is limitless: « The LORD has established his throne in the heavens, and his kingdom rules over all ». Psalm 103:19
- 6. The kingdom of God shall be ruled by the saints: « And the kingdom and the dominion and the greatness of the kingdoms under the whole heaven shall be given to the people of the saints of the Most High; his kingdom shall be an everlasting kingdom, and all dominions shall serve and obey him. » Daniel 7:27
- 7. The only way to access the kingdom of God is through repentance : « Repent, for the kingdom of heaven is at hand ». Matthew 3:2
- 8. The kingdom is meant for the humble and obedient : « Blessed are the poor in spirit, for theirs is the kingdom of heaven ». Matthew 5:3
- No one enters the kingdom without carrying his cross:
 « Blessed are those who are persecuted for righteousness' sake, for theirs is the kingdom of heaven ». Matthew 5:10
- 10. The kingdom of God is about teaching God's will: « Therefore whoever relaxes one of the least of these commandments and teaches others to do the same will be called least in the kingdom of heaven, but whoever does them and teaches them will be called great in the kingdom of heaven. For I tell you, unless your righteousness exceeds that of the scribes and Pharisees, you will never enter the kingdom of heaven. Matthew 5.19–20
- 11. The kingdom of God is for the doers of God's will not mere speakers: « Not everyone who says to me, 'Lord, Lord,' will enter the kingdom of heaven, but the one who does the will of my Father who is in heaven. ». Matthew 7:21
- 12. The kingdom of God is accessed by the violent and soldiers for God: « From the days of John the Baptist until now the kingdom of heaven has suffered violence, and the violent take it by force ».Matthew 11:12
- 13. The kingdom of God is made out of secrets to be unveiled: "To you it has been given to know the secrets of the kingdom of heaven, but to them it has not been given." Matthew 13:11
- 14. The kingdom of God requires us to abandon all to follow Christ: « The kingdom of heaven is like treasures hidden in a field, which a man found and covered up. Then in his joy he goes and sells all that he has and buys that field ». « Matthew 13:44
- 15. The only way to enter the kingdom of God is to act like children joyful and confident: and said, "Truly, I say to you, unless you turn and become like children, you will never enter the kingdom of heaven." Matthew 18:3

The Kingdom of Heaven Suffers Violence

Jesus said, "The Kingdom of God suffers violence", but what that really means is an important aspect of our faith. It can be interpreted in various forms. It may imply that our faith is a weapon in spiritual battle. Jesus' statement that the kingdom of God suffers violence is found in the context of His commendation of John the Baptist: "And from the days of John the Baptist until now the kingdom of heaven suffers violence, and the violent take it by force" (Matthew 11:12,

NKJV).

But How can God's kingdom suffer, and what do violent people have to do with it? Through hermeneutics as read from the book of Luke 5:15; 12:21, the pressing multitudes that had followed John continued to follow Jesus' ministry could be a key to understanding Jesus' statement that the kingdom of God suffers violence. Pointing to the huge crowds that followed John and that were now following Him, Jesus likens them to an invading army surrounding a city to capture it. Therefore just as warriors the price of our salvation is too great to lazy around and distract ourselves. Timing, praying, fasting and preaching violently and relentlessly should be our

There must be just as the times of John baptist an extraordinary rush of people pressing in from all sides, eager for a blessing, thronging to hear the gospel that they resembled an army trying to besiege a city, beating down the doors to enter. To attend this goal is the responsibility of every soldier or child of God. Here violence refers to the level of enthusiasm, hunger for truth, nothing capable of holding back and being eager to meet the Messiah.

The passion for christ

The Passion refers to the brief period of pain, suffering and enduring final period before the death of Jesus. This significant moment is described in the four canonical gospels. It is commemorated in Christianity every year during Holy Week and symbolyzed most often by Christ Crowned with

The passion for Christ portrays a number of teachings such as humility, antidote to pride. We are saved more by humility and obedience than by our merits. Christ physical suffering show us the way. If Christ had suffered everything He did but had not willed it, we would not be saved.

All our lives should be resumed passion for Christ as He is the only way, the ultimate truth and the real life we are all looking for. The Bible says in that regard in the book of Matthew 5:6: Blessed are those who hunger and thirst for righteousness, for they will be filled. This is all about cultivating a habit of spending time with Jesus, learning His life style, being committed to living like Jesus. Then radiating the passion to others.

In clear, we should believe strongly in Jesus Christ day and night. We must also share His passion for His Father our God and fight for the Kingdom of Light. The 12 gates and 12 angels

The Book of Revelation 21: 12 tells us about the New Jerusalem by stating that it is made of 12 gates and 12 angels. The 12 gates bear each the name of the tribe of Israel. If it can appear obvious that the aim of these 12 gates and angels is to secure the city according to God's perfect government, an insight exploration still remains necessary. The 12 gates and 12 angels are a symbol therefore of heavenly realm characterized by eternal holiness far from any form of impurity and wickedness as we will be protected from it. The existence of these walls, and gates, serve as realities and symbols of safety and security of those living in New Jerusalem or who are in Christ Jesus.

The new jerusalem

In Revelation 21:2, the apostle John talks of a new Jerusalem that he saw in a vision. The said new Jerusalem is the second creation after the present world will be ended. It will be an earthly location with new earth and heaven where only true believers will be admitted and will live in forever. The fruits of the spirit of god

The fruits of the Holy Spirit are mentioned in Galatians 5:22, they are: love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness and self-control. Love refers to selflessness and truthfulness (1 Corinthians 13:4–8). Joy is another important fruit of the Spirit. It is all about comforting and self contentment. It is an enduring attitude of the heart and spirit, and a natural part of the Christian faith. It is linked

with, but not limited to, following Jesus and pursuing a Christian life. Peace refers to the lack of conflict, tranquility, inexistence of war, to be filled with what is good therefore in security and in the respect of rules and regulations edicted for that ultimate purpose. Patience is all about an enduring spirit, self mastery, calm in a period of storm and difficulties. To be able to wait for long despite our passions and burning desires. To remain silent without getting angry and complaint. There is no place for discouragement but ability to persevere. Kindness is all about being deliberately good to others, natural, having feelings for others, produce or increase others welfare. The quality of being friendly, generous and considerate. To render assistance while expecting nothing in return. Goodness refers to virtue, Godliness, contradiction to all what is evil or negative. The Scriptures are full with the goodness of the Lord and just like in His image we are called upon to copy the perfect example leading to success through the only way, truth and the life. Reliable, sure, trustworthy are words describing the concept of Faithfulness. This is in total contradiction of any person who is infidel, unbelieving, lacking religious faith. Faithfulness is therefore all about being worthy of belief or trust. Gentleness is all about being worthy of doing what is nice, good, avoid what is violent, harsh. A synonym for gentleness could also be meekness. To be gentle is to be courteous. What God expects from us, is a strong hand with a soft touch. We ought to be compassionate, show understanding towards other people weaknesses and limitations. We should learn to be caring and treat others with care and love (1 Thessalonians 2:7). Concerning self control is all about mastering our greatest and strongest enemy ourself, nature, environment and forces are mastered by self is our passions, emotions, desires, pleasures do not dominate our spirit and willingness to do the right thing according to God not as we desire things.

The holy ghost

There is an abundant Biblical literature on the Holy Ghost. Jesus Christ taught that the Holy Ghost is the comforter. It is sent by the father through our Lord to testify of the kingdom of God, the truth about the Messiah (John 15:26). The Holy Ghost is defined and baptized with many names such as Counselor; Comforter; Baptizer; Advocate; Strengthener; Sanctifier; Spirit of Christ (not the same as the spirit of Christ); Seven-Fold Spirit (Rev.); Spirit of Truth; Spirit of Grace; Spirit of Mercy; Spirit of God; Spirit of Holiness; Spirit of Life.

The Holy Ghost is capital in Christian life as He enables believers to dwell in the presence of God, to do the righteous thing and live a Godly faithful and prayerful life. We are nothing, can't anything without the mighty move of God through the Holy Ghost.

The particularity of the Holy Ghost compared to the other personalities of the Trinity is that blasphemies, sins against Him can never be forgiven. Such faults are considered eternal and characterized as unclean spirits. Therefore anyone who hardens his heart and refuse to repent and believe in Christ lead to eternal damnation.

The Holy Ghost is the tool God uses to identify and consecrate his owns (Luke 3 : 22). It is the evidence that God is pleased with a believer. This is because the Holy Ghost is the rightful owner of our bodies which should be preserved as a holy temple (1 corinthians 6 : 19-20). (Romans 15: 13). It is only through the Holy Ghost that we may be sanctified (Matthew 3: 11). It is the main key to enter the kingdom of God. The Holy Ghost is the messenger and testifies of Jesus in our lives (4. John 15:26).
